

# EN Graduate Nurse Applications –

## **Enrolled Nurses**

Mansfield District Hospital's Enrolled Nurse (EN) Graduate Nurse Program is designed to consolidate knowledge, skills, and competence, and transition new EN graduates to practice as safe, confident and accountable professionals.

#### Who is eligible?

- ENs who are Registered with APHRA as an Enrolled Nurse (Diploma of Nursing qualification) or will be registered by February 2021
- EN graduates must be in their first year of practice
- · Applicants will be required to attend an interview

#### **Application Instructions:**

- Letter of application, addressing the criteria below:
  Why would you like to be considered for the program
  What you would like to achieve by entering the program
- 2. Completed Application for Employment form (download from www.mdh.org.au)
- 3. Curriculum vitae including placement history and two professional / clinical referees. One must be a clinical referee (please include their work email addresses)
- 4. Certified copy of academic transcript with results legend
- 5. Passport sized photograph
- 6. Two most recent clinical placement reports (at least one must be from an acute placement including formative and summative)
- 7. Current Police **and** Working with Children checks to be presented at interview. Along with current immunisation record.
